School Profile

Community	Augusta, an urban residential community of 18,500 people located in Kennebec County, is the capital of the State of Maine. A variety of employment opportunities exists, with a large percentage of the population employed by federal, state and local government agencies. The University of Maine at Augusta offers four year degrees, along with continuing education opportunities for over 3,000 full and part time students.																
School	Cony is accredited by the Maine Department of Education, and has joined the New England Secondary School Consortium, working with the Great Schools Partnership. Cony offers a comprehensive program of studies for approximately 1000 students in grades 7 – 12. As of the 2009/2010 school year, Cony operates on a 4 x 4 block schedule, with students taking no more than four courses each semester, on a daily 75 minute block. AP Biology and AP Chemistry extend into two semesters and meet daily, earning 2 credits each. AP Calculus, AP Statistics, AP English Literature, AP English Language, AP Government, and AP US History extend into two semesters, meeting every other day, and earn 1 credit each.																
Grading System	A=93-100, B=85-92, C=76-84, D=70-75, F=below 70.																
Curriculum and Rank in Class	Cony offers several course level options to maximize student success: College preparatory, Honors and/or AP level classes, and Tech Prep/Integrated level classes in English, math and science. Dual Enrollment opportunities are available with the Univ. of Maine at Augusta English 101 and UMA Digital Photography. Dual Enrollment credit through Kennebec Valley Community College for Biology 101 (Anatomy) and Spanish 101 (Spanish 4,5) Dual Enrollment credit through Thomas College for College Algebra (Senior Math).. Students may also take Adult Education classes (AE), AP4All, and on-site or on-line college classes. Advanced placement, honors and college classes are given a greater weight toward class rank only. Grade point average is not weighted.																
AP Courses	Approved Advanced Placement Courses: United States History, English Literature and Composition, English Language and Composition, Biology, American Government, Calculus, Statistics, Physics and Chemistry (offered on a bi-annual basis). AP Biology is offered in this 2016-2017 academic year.																
Honors Courses	Anatomy, Calculus, Honors Algebra 1 and 2, Honors Biology, Honors Chemistry, Honors English 1, 2, Honors Geometry, Honors Global Insights, Honors Physics, Honors World History, Latin 3 and 4, Spanish 3 and 4, French 3 and 4, German 3 and 4, and Honors Precalculus.																
Graduation Requirements	24 credits which include the following courses and number of years each: English 4, Mathematics 3, Sciences 3, Social Studies 3, Health/PE 1 ½, and Fine Arts 1. There is a 20 hour community service requirement. Beginning with the Class of 2018, both Science and Math requirements increase to 3.5 courses each.
