

FOOD SERVICES MANAGEMENT

The school system, in compliance with federal and state law, and with the rules and regulations of the Department of Education, shall operate a school nutrition program, which shall be under the direction of the school lunch supervisor. A school lunch manager shall be assigned to each school serving meals under this program. The business manager shall exercise control of the overall operation and efficiency of the school nutrition program and its expenditures.

In organizational relationship, the school lunch manager in each school is directly responsible to the district school lunch supervisor, but shall cooperate with the principal of the school in matters essential to the proper functioning of the food services program. The responsibility for control of students using the cafeteria shall rest with the building principal.

The board shall approve the prices set for school lunches and the price of milk. Menus shall be released to the local press one week in advance.

As required for participation in the National School Lunch Program, the board agrees to the following regulations:

1. That a "Type A" lunch be made available for students.
2. That free and reduced-price lunches be provided students who cannot afford to pay the price of the "Type A" lunch.

Students shall also be permitted to bring their lunches from home and to purchase beverages and incidental items.
