Title I is a federally funded program designed to provide all children significant opportunity to receive a fair, equitable, and high quality education, and to close educational achievement gaps. (ESEA section 1001). Title I upgrades supports and works to improve student academic achievement across the entire school. Gilbert School operates a schoolwide program, where funds are used to implement reforms that upgrade the entire educational program of the school.

Additional literacy and math services are provided to students in need of supplemental support. Services are flexible with no parent notification required. Children can be pulled out of their classrooms, or staff may push-in to provide supplemental support, depending on student need.

Parents/guardians play an important role in assisting their child's learning and are encouraged to be actively involved in their child's education. All teachers will work in collaboration with parents/guardians to gain feedback on needs wherein parent involvement activities and plans will be implemented for all families.

Parent Advisory/PTO

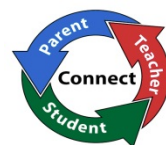

Parent/Teacher Conferences



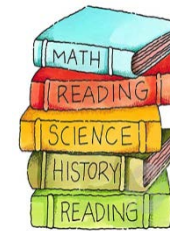
Provides an opportunity for parents/guardians and teachers to discuss student progress toward meeting Common Core Standards.
