Show an interest. Talk to your child about information that is sent home from school.

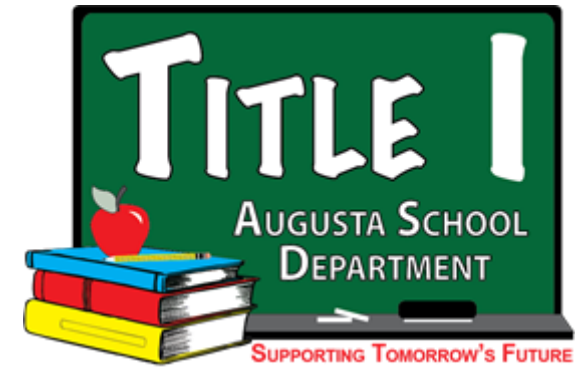
Communicate with your child's teachers.

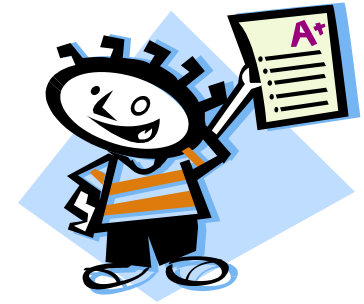
Teachers, Tutors & Administrator responsibilities will include:

- Recognize students as individuals with different learning styles and needs
- Provide quality instruction in a supportive learning environment
- Use the most recent and successful methods of instruction
- Provide supplemental reading and/or math materials to be used at home
- Have high expectations for all students
- Have grade level standards available to parents
- Involve parents in school decisions regarding their child's learning
- Keep parents informed through Title I parent meetings, workshops, progress reports, emails, phone calls and newsletters



Parent responsibilities include:

- Please make sure your child attends school at their scheduled time.
- Attend Parent-Teacher Conferences
- Read to and with your child regularly
- Participate in Title I meeting and workshops.
- Read and respond to notices sent home
- Make school a priority by scheduling appointments and vacations outside of school hours when possible
- Provide time and a place to do homework, and give assistance when needed
- Monitor and limit television, video games, internet and texting
- Promote a positive attitude toward school and learning



Student responsibilities include:

- Attend school regularly
- Come read to learn
- Respect others, their property, and their feelings
- Be actively involved in learning
- Do my best with schoolwork and homework and complete assignments on time
- Ask for help when I don't understand
- Return borrowed materials/books to school as instructed
- Bring home notices and forms to my parents/guardians and return signed forms to school
